Pearl Group News

It has once again been an eventful year in Pearl's history. The biggest change to the business took place on 1 May 2008 when Pearl Group acquired Resolution plc, a FTSE100 company.

Pearl is now a top 10 UK life company and the UK's largest specialist manager of closed life and pension funds. Today Pearl Group has £73.1 billion of assets under management and 7.7 million policyholders. Companies in the group include: Pearl, London Life, NPI, Phoenix, Scottish Provident and Scottish Mutual. Pearl Group remains privately owned by two large investment organisations, Sun Capital and TDR Capital.

With the acquisition of Resolution came new offices in Wythall, near Birmingham, Glasgow, London and Dublin and as part of the long term business strategy, Pearl announced in September that it will be transferring almost all business activities from Glasgow and Peterborough, into Wythall over the next two and a half years.

The decision to leave Peterborough and Glasgow was reached only after a great deal of careful thought and consideration and is a necessary, though difficult decision to enable the business to continue to be more sustainable in the long term. The move will enable Pearl to consolidate knowledge and experience, in order to achieve the aim of creating an integrated and sustainable business model which offers value for customers and shareholders.

A major relocation programme has been launched and all staff will be offered the chance to apply for vacant Group roles in Wythall. A comprehensive programme of outplacement support is also in place to assist employees for whom relocation is not an option in achieving reemployment as soon as possible.

Holborn race, 1951

Harry Prier thought this photograph may be of interest to those who worked at Holborn in the 1950s.

A wheel big challenge!

John Jones, retired District Manager D3 (Liskeard) wrote the following letter to Pension News – it's a tale we thought you might enjoy!

"There is no fool like an old fool, and this old fool at age 78 volunteered to run a mile for Sports Relief 2008 this year. All was going well until I changed my venue for training from the nice tarmac path through Plym woods, to Roborough Down on Dartmoor.

One wet Sunday afternoon, I was going great guns over Roborough Down, when I slipped on some mud and broke my ankle. At that point, well-wishers had backed me to well over £500, and I felt totally depressed as I was rushed to the A&E department at Derriford hospital. There I met a great guy, a German doctor, Doctor Derek Aldtag. Pardon the pun, but he spoke to me like a 'Dutch uncle' and said, "Now come on, cheer up. I'll make you as comfortable as possible, so why don't you go on television and appeal for a wheelchair to complete the mile?" He then organised a whip round on the

ward for me. I took his advice and went on Spotlight Southwest and appealed for a wheelchair. The first person to answer that appeal was a man suffering from multiple sclerosis. Can you believe it! I was choked, and gladly accepted his offer.

I turned up on the day on Plymouth Hoe, and a young student from the C.F.E who was also running in the race asked if I would like him to push me round the course. I readily agreed – and my young friend promptly overtook everyone in sight and completed the course in an astonishing twelve minutes. It was the most exhilarating wheelchair ride I could ever wish for; in fact it had all the excitement of a Roman Chariot race!

But the kindness of folk didn't end there. I moved to this area only last July, but my next-door neighbour took on board some of my problems immediately and assisted my wife and I in so many ways.

I have no wish to break my ankle again, but so many positive things came out of my experience; and to cap it all I raised £625 for Sports Relief.

I don't know if you would describe this as the 'sting in the tale', but the Sports Relief H.Q expressed their deep appreciation for all I had done and sent me a pair of RUNNING SHOES as a 'thank you' present!! Someone has a good sense of humour...and I love it.
