
There were just a few shadowy ships passing the end of the pier. None of us ventured the walk to the end, a mile and a third away.

A CHAMPION PATIENT

I joined the Pearl in August 1964 at the Lewes Office in Sussex (AA11) and left the Company in April 1996. I transferred from Lewes to Brighton in 1967, when I was relocated to the Eastbourne office.



An active member of Brighton Athletic Club, I managed to qualify for the main Championship race at the Great North Run by being

the first Pearl man over the line at the Regional events in the South. I did become the overall Pearl Champion in 1989 as the previous Champion had left the Company. I ran the 1987 London Marathon in two hours and 31 minutes.

In 1993/4 I began to develop a 'wobble' in my body, which meant that I was unable to stand without holding onto something, or walk without being affected by sudden spasms

in my abdomen. Despite being sent to various 'ologists, it wasn't until I saw a Neurologist in 1998 that I was diagnosed with Dystonia. There are various forms of this condition and my particular form is quite rare, (about 20 known cases in the world).

Over the next five years my condition deteriorated as the spasms made my stomach muscles very strong, and my back muscles were not strong enough to hold me upright, therefore I was almost bent double. It was a constant struggle to maintain any sort of mobility. In 2003 I underwent a pioneering operation called Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS) surgery which has restored me to almost normal.

This involved implanting two electrodes into my brain and being connected, via a cable under my skin, to a battery in my stomach which sends an electrical pulse into my brain. I am on battery number four, which is re-chargeable. This does conjure up an amusing scenario of Frankenstein proportions!

Dystonia is a 'neuro-movement disorder' condition which is non-life threatening in the main and affects many thousands of people. There is no known cause, or a cure, at this time, the DBS is only a partial control. There is a Charity, the Dystonia Society, of which I am an active member.

This he did, then, never one to miss an opportunity asked the widow if she had any insurance herself. On replying in the negative he promptly wrote a policy there and then on top of the coffin!



IN MEMORY OF GILBERT DAVEY

Gilbert Davey, who died on 6th April aged 97, was the oldest member of the Peterborough Pensioners' Club.

I first met him when he was a Fire & Accident Inspector at Pearl's prestigious West End Branch. He later became the assistant manager at RO9, moved to Peterborough in 1975 and finally became my assistant in GB Accounts. But his insurance career pales into insignificance when compared with a largely unknown part of his life, which ran concurrently with that at Pearl.

Gilbert was known to be a radio enthusiast and I knew he had written some books about the early developing days of radio.

Many years later I decided to 'Google' him only to find pages and pages about his achievements as one of the country's top amateur radio experts, an interest he developed as a young boy, astonishing family and friends by building his own radio. This passion remained with him throughout his life and in 1947 he began submitting articles to the widely read Boy's Own Paper. So impressed was the editor that Gilbert continued to write for the paper until its closure in 1967. During the late 1940s and 1950s he topped the popularity poll among BOP readers, on occasions receiving up to 8,000 letters a week.

In 1957 he wrote his first book 'Fun With Radio' (a signed copy of which he later gave to my young son) which was an instant success; so much so that it was updated six times with the final

edition being in 1978. He followed this up with five more books in the 'Fun With' series, which featured short wave radio, transistors, Hi Fi, electronics and silicon chips in modern radio and also finding time to be a contributor to Pears Junior Encyclopaedia. Not to be overshadowed by the increasing popularity of television, Gilbert presented a six-part series on a BBC children's magazine programme called 'Studio E' and within a few days of the first programme it received a staggering 26,000 letters.

Gilbert was justifiably proud of his long association with the Boy's Own Paper and its offshoot publications. He was equally gratified that he had introduced thousands of boys and girls to a fascinating hobby and, in many cases, a rewarding career.

The part of Gilbert's life that he would never talk about was his role in World War II. The Royal Signals was the obvious choice, where he rose to the rank of major serving in France with the secretive and highly dangerous Special Operations Executive. Beyond telling me that, and although the war ended as long ago as 1945, Gilbert claimed he was still bound by the Official Secrets Act. But the magic of Google revealed that, stationed in Germany at the end of the war, Gilbert was the first British amateur to operate a transmitter in the British sector of Berlin, when he made contact with all parts of the world with just 10 watts' transmitting power.

It is hard to believe that this quiet and modest man who left school aged 15 with no qualifications could have

achieved so much without his Pearl colleagues knowing and I feel very privileged to have both known and worked with him. By keying 'Gilbert Davey' into Google, then clicking on 'The Studio E One Valve Radio' further information on Gilbert's amazing life can be found.
